

The CTA is bound by the General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR), meaning that we must have members' active consent to retain your contact information and to contact you. This includes sending regular newsletters, information about upcoming events, details of our annual conference, and the proceedings of our conference, published annually in *New Blackfriars*. We ask all members to provide their postal address and email address at the time of joining, and to consent to us using this information to contact you.

We also hold a database of members' contact details in the 'Members' Area' of our website. This may only be accessed by members who have completed a GDPR consent form themselves. The contact information you display is entirely your choice – you may share as much or as little contact information as you choose. This information is shared to facilitate professional networks of Catholic theologians for finding reviewers, external examiners, and so forth. Members may not use this information to create their own mailing lists, and the committee may require members who abuse this facility to resign from the association.

The CTA will not forward any of your details to a third party without your express permission, and you can always instruct us to delete your information at any time.
